

STORY BEHIND THE CURVE

- Parents & youth are not accessing services in our community.
- Family Parents & youth with special needs are not educated about the resources in the community.
- Bullying
- Low Self-Esteem
- Less resources than for elementary and high school aged youth
- Beginning to talk about graduation path
- Critical point for education and career planning
- Parent education on academic and career path options
- Medical concerns
- Beginning independence in medical and social care
- Long APD waiting list (last chance to sign up)
- Lack of interdisciplinary approach and hard balance between independence and continued assistance
